Key Meeting Action/Discussion Highlights	
Oral Health Collaborative (OHC)	<p>Dr. Monica Wu updated the committee on the Oral Health Collaborative (OHC). The next OHC meeting is on Tuesday, May 8th. The SCC Public Health Department will reveal the chosen contractor to perform the county-wide oral health assessment for Santa Clara County.</p>
Give Kids a Smile 2018	<p>Michael Tran reported to the committee on Give Kids a Smile (GKAS).</p> <p>The GKAS final stats were completed and overall the numbers of students needing recommended care or urgent care were similar to last year. There was a drop in the total number of children screened overall, but that was due to the lack of nurses at some of the schools and the result was that there were less children screened overall.</p> <p>Michael will forward the stats to Dr. Monica Wu and Dr. Sarah Murray so they could present at the May GMM.</p> <p>The three winners of the GKAS poster contest were chosen by the members voting at the April GMM. Michael needs volunteer dentists to help deliver the GKAS prizes to the winners and present oral health education to the classes afterwards.</p>

<p>Give Seniors a Smile (GSAS)</p>	<p>Oral cancer screenings at Live Oak Adult Day Care Center April 25, 2018</p> <p>9:00 AM</p> <p>Oral screening dentists: Dr. George Barghouth Dr. Sarah Murray Dr. Angela Laithangbam Michael Tran as SCCDS supporting staff</p> <p>Number of seniors seen: 9* All 9 rated as "no further evaluation needed at this time, have you dentist re-evaluate at next check-up." Oral health brochures and material, badges, SCCDS contact info was given to each senior after the screening. Most came with their caregiver.</p> <p>*Live Oak said some cancelled because they had dental insurance or they think they have dentures and don't have to see a dentist. Dr. Sarah Murray said dentures may hide oral cancer so the seniors who cancelled or no-showed should still be screened for oral cancer. Live Oak will communicate that the next time there is another screening.</p> <p>The oral cancer screening results for each senior were left with Live Oak staff where they will keep on file and make photocopies for the seniors to take home. Dr. Sarah Murray will have additions and changes to the oral screening forms. Michael left the surveys and denture care instructions with live oak staff to distribute.</p> <p>Afterwards there was a meeting with Ms. Colleen Hudgens the executive director of Live Oak. She said there is the Health Fair on Fri, October 26 and Sat, October 27. She was hoping if the dentists could come out there and perform dental screenings there too at least on Sat October 27. She raised the possibility of having cleanings, but Dr. Barghouth said there are issues with infection and control and the equipment would have to be sterilized. He will talk to Dr. Beveridge regarding this issue at the Community Services Meeting on May 2. Dr. Murray also said there could be liability issues too for example someone claiming their tooth is now wiggling after the cleaning because the plaque was holding it in place.</p> <p>Michael also passed out the dental services survey to the seniors of Live Oak Adult Day Care Center. Michael will collect the survey results before the next committee meeting.</p>
<p>Portable Dentistry Equipment</p>	<p>Michael Tran reported on portable dental equipment.</p>

The Foundation COULD provide up to \$10,000 funding for portable dental equipment. This committee need to prove to the Foundation that they have a program or events that will make use of this portable equipment maybe 7-8 times a year. They don't want the portable equipment to just sit and collect dust. A program outline/proposal for the funding would be useful for the Foundation.

There were concerns with using portable dentistry equipment from Dr. Barghouth:

Before we consider any portable dentistry, we would like to discuss the logistics for this practice

1. Location (health fair will not work – open to public)
2. Medical history clearance
3. Infection control
4. Liability insurance
5. Where to keep records
6. Whom to contact for emergency after the treatment
7. Prophy in public places (polishing) could deceive patients thinking that they got complete prophy without proper diagnosis

I would like to do it in private locations not in Health fair
There is benefit more benefits to patients if we purchase diagnostic equipments to collect information find a dentist to treat

Diagnostic equipment such as

1. Portable x-ray machine
2. Sensors
3. Intraoral camera
4. Laptop
5. Mirrors

This will be added to the prevention plans such as

1. Fluoride Varnish
2. Caries Risk Assessment
3. Oral cancer screening
4. Sealant
5. SDF

We also could do temporary therapeutic treatment but that needs more equipment
